**Updates in Treating Speech Sound Disorders in Children: It's About Time!**

Clinicians are faced with new ideas to consider and information to integrate into clinical application at a pace that often makes it difficult to implement into clinical practice. The time required to learn the new approaches, to develop the individualized treatment materials, and to implement the new procedures are frequently beyond the scope of already burdened daily schedules. This workshop is for clinicians who want to keep current with the pace of recent advances in the assessment and treatment of speech sound disorders in children. Models of assessment, target selection approaches, and current models of phonological intervention will be discussed.

- Complete phonological analyses from a relational and systemic perspective.
- Select treatment targets that will have the greatest impact on phonological restructuring.
- Design and implement four contrastive models of phonological intervention (minimal pairs, multiple oppositions, maximal oppositions, and treatment of the empty set).

**Lynn Williams, Ph.D., CCC-SLP**

Dr. Lynn Williams is a full professor at East Tennessee State University. Her recent work includes development of a new model of phonological intervention called multiple oppositions that has been the basis of federally funded intervention studies by the National Institutes of Health (NIH); authored several articles in a variety of journals, as well as published several book chapters; developed a phonological intervention software program called Sound Contrasts in Phonology (SCIP) that was funded by NIH; authored a book *Speech Disorders Resource Guide for Preschool Children*; and served as associate editor of *Language, Speech, and Hearing Services in the Schools*. Lynn is a Fellow of ASHA.
